Join us for the second of our patient research evenings aimed at giving patients and their relatives the opportunity to hear from, and meet leading doctors and scientists in Chronic Lymphocytic Leukaemia (CLL) research. University Hospitals Birmingham and the University of Birmingham are hotbeds of both basic science research and clinical trials, offering patients the chance of new treatments and to contribute their samples to furthering human understanding of CLL and cancer as a whole.

The evening will consist of short, easy-to-follow 20 minute talks on various aspects of CLL research and patient care. There will be plenty of opportunity for questions and discussion.

### Speakers

#### Professor Tatjana Stankovic

Professor Stankovic leads a research group in cancer genetics and has published numerous scientific papers in the field of CLL. Professor Stankovic will be talking on current CLL research being conducted in the West Midlands using blood samples kindly donated by patients.



#### Professor Paul Moss

Professor Moss is the lead for Chronic Lymphocytic Leukaemia at Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Birmingham and is director of research and knowledge transfer in the college of medicine. He also leads an active research group in immunology and immunotherapy. Professor Moss will be discussing current management of patients with CLL.



#### Dr Shankara Paneesha

Dr Paneesha is the lead for Chronic Lymphocytic Leukaemia management at Heartlands Hospital, Birmingham and is principal investigator on numerous clinical trials. Dr Paneesha will be discussing current clinical trials that are open in the West Midlands for patients with CLL.



#### Dr Helen Parry

Dr Helen Parry is an NIHR clinical lecturer in haematology with a research interest in CLL and infection. She recently co-authored the UK guidelines for management of patients with CLL. Dr Parry will be discussing the infection risks and vaccination strategies recommended for patients with CLL.



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
